What an amazing year of growth! In 2023, The Foundation saw the development of three new donor funds—a donor-designated fund and two scholarship funds—all expected to be operational within a few short weeks and benefiting our Northwest Illinois neighbors in perpetuity. Because of the generosity of forward-thinking donors, we continue to create opportunities for greater community impact and positive social change.

Through our new educational initiative, the Northwest Illinois Nonprofit Alliance (NINA), The Foundation has increased its engagement with area organizations,

further advancing the nonprofit business sector. Resources and opportunities associated with NINA include the Coffee Connections peer roundtables, networking events, and the annual THRIVE: Nonprofit Leadership Symposium.

The Foundation also continues to broaden the reach of our Marvin • Wilson Community Needs granting which supports the program and project needs of nonprofit organizations serving Stephenson, Jo Daviess, and Carroll counties. New nonprofits from all around the region come under that umbrella every grant cycle.

We began 2023 as the Freeport Community Foundation and we finish the year as The Foundation for Northwest Illinois. While our name has changed and new, exciting things are happening, our mission remains—to empower nonprofits to develop solutions to help Northwest Illinois communities thrive.

Featured Projects & Initiatives

Discover Your Future is a program of the Blackhawk Area Council of Boy Scouts of America. The program provides quality career building opportunities to Freeport area youth at the Exploring Post stationed at the Freeport Fire Station. Blackhawk Area Council also partners with other public safety organizations and businesses to expand the Exploring Post and offers more options for the diverse career interests of youth in the area.

Blackhawk Area Council has established 3 more Exploring Posts to encompass a variety of career interest areas that will attract and enrich youth and inspire them to participate in their own community.

The Freeport Art Museum's *BIPOC Initiative* (Black, Indigenous, People of Color) encourages artists of color to view FAM as a welcoming venue to exhibit their work and seeks to develop an improved relationship with the broader BIPOC community. It brings artists who to exhibit their work, share knowledge, and select future artists to show at the Freeport Art Museum, working to help undo Native invisibility, address anti-Blackness, dismantle white supremacy, and advance racial justice.

Self-identified BIPOC artists select work to be featured in the main galleries, thereby removing the 'institutional' selection process in favor of giving participating artists a larger voice. Although poverty is considered a major reason for food insecurity, the underlying issues that lead to it are many. Lack of affordable housing, social isolation, chronic or acute health problems, high medical costs, limited access and low wages all increase the likelihood that eating patterns can be disrupted due to the inability to pay for food or access it though other resources.

In 2022, more than \$40,000 was granted to 25 food pantries and meal programs throughout Stephenson, Jo Daviess and Carroll counties.

The Foundation is very aware of the extreme need throughout the region and leads efforts to provide assistance even while the need continues to grow.
